**The Baptism of the Lord – January 8<sup>th</sup>** - You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased. The baptism of Jesus marks an important beginning in his ministry. While we do not know much of his life between his birth and this moment, we know of his divine calling. We know the richness of his ministry that is to come after his baptism. May it inspire in us a deeper commitment to our baptismal call.

### Liturgy this week:

Mon. Jan. 8 – **The Baptims of the Lord** (F) Fri. Jan 12 – St. Marguerite Bourgeoys, Virgin (M)

**Ordinary Time -** After the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Ordinary Time begins. Ordinary does not mean plain. The name comes from "ordinalis" meaning "showing order, denoting an order of succession." It is used in this sense to refer to the order of the counted weeks. That is to say, it is a season of counted weeks.

Ordinary Time after the Baptism focuses on the early life and childhood of Christ, and then on His public ministry. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green; however, as in all seasons, other appropriate colors are worn on particular feast days. (For example, white is typically worn for Marian feast days, except in some Spanish countries where blue is an approved liturgical color) Vocations - The Son of God was first manifested to the world through the visit of the magi. Today, God's Son is brought into the world and is present to the world through His Church. If you think that God is calling you to be a priest, religious, or permanent deacon, call Fr. ### PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

#### The Precepts of the Church describe the minimum effort we must make in prayer and in living a moral life.

- <u>"You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of</u> <u>obligation and rest from servile labour."</u> It requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days. (CCC 2042)
- <u>"You shall confess your sins at least once a year."</u> It ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.
- <u>"You shall receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist at</u> <u>least during the Easter season."</u> It guarantees a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feast, the origin and center of the Christian Liturgy.
- <u>"You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence</u> <u>established by the Church."</u> It ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart. (CCC2043)
- <u>"You shall help to provide for the needs of the</u> <u>Church."</u> It means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.
