LENT 2024

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends before the Eucharistic liturgy on Holy Thursday evening. Lent is a penitential season. It recalls the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert, and the 40 years the Israelites wandered in the desert. Lent focuses on the events leading up to Christ's passion, and finally on the Passion itself. The liturgical colour of Lent s purple, a sign of reflection and conversion.

Ash Wednesday – Receiving the ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday reminds us of the passage of time, and our constant need to turn away from wrongdoing. Wearing ashes on our foreheads indicates our willingness to do penance.
