Countdown for Lent

Why is Easter 2025 later than usual? Easter's date varies each year between March 22 and April 25. In 2025, Easter is on April 20, which is toward the later end of this range. This is because the Paschal Full Moon falls on April 12, the first full moon after the March 21 equinox, placing Easter on the following Sunday.

- Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 5th this year. Receiving the ashes on our foreheads reminds us of the passage of time, and our constant need to turn away from wrongdoing. Wearing ashes on our foreheads indicates our willingness to do penance.
- All Fridays in Lent there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and the opportunity to enrich your faith with a video of about 50 minutes.
