Vincentian Meditation: We are called to be servants of the poor. And, mercy, says Vincent, is the "proper attribute of God himself." Mercy is a facet of charity that calls us, first to identify in spirit with the other person. For instance, St. Vincent tells us, "To be compassionate toward the sufferings of our neighbor and to weep with him...to soften our hearts and to render them responsive to their sufferings and miseries." Indeed, "love gains for us an entrance into the hearts of others." Mercy calls as well for outward signs or gestures. As St. Vincent observed, "Heart and hand should go together as far as possible." Consequently, he urges, "Weep with your poor and your sick. God has appointed you to be their consolation...Serve the poor with gentleness, compassion and love."

Hierarchy of Celebrations. - The Church in her wisdom and following the Tradition of the first Christians, has established a hierarchy to follow when it comes to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. On the first day of each week, which is known as the Day of the Lord or the Lord's Day, the Church, by an apostolic tradition that draws its origin from the very day of the Resurrection of Christ, celebrates the Paschal Mystery.

- 1) Sunday must be considered the primordial feast day.
- **2) Solemnity** Same elements of Mass as a Sunday: Gloria, two readings, psalm, Gospel, Creed. Solemnities have *proper* prayers and readings specific to the day.
- **3) Feast** Elements of Mass: Gloria, one reading, psalm, Gospel. Feasts have proper prayers and readings specific to the day.
- **4) Obligatory Memorial** (i.e., a Saint): Elements of Mass are the same as a standard daily Mass. Memorials have some *proper* prayers. Memorials *may* have specific readings, but they the ferial readings may also be used [and the Church encourages use of daily or ferial readings in most cases, to avoid disrupting the cycle of readings].
- 5) Optional Memorial. The Celebrant decides if it is celebrated instead of a regular mass.
- **6) Commemoration** [during Lent and the latter part of Advent, memorials become commemorations].

Note: Some memorials and feasts are elevated to solemnities in particular nations, dioceses, parishes, communities; especially the feasts of patrons. There are also **votive Masses**, which may be celebrated when there isn't a Sunday, solemnity, feast, or obligatory memorial -- votive Masses have proper prayers and specific (but optional) readings. In example, a mass of the <u>Blessed</u> Virgin on every Saturday.
