# Holy Week is the week which precedes the Great Feast of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday!

*Palm Sunday.* Every Mass today recalls the Messianic entrance of the Lord Jesus into Jerusalem, coming to complete his Paschal Mystery.

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King in Hamilton On Monday. The Mass is presided over by the Bishop and concelebrated by the Priests from all parts of the Diocese. It is a sign of unity and communion of the Priests with their Bishop.

The Sacred Paschal Triduum: This celebration is the high point in the Liturgical year. It opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (Holy Thursday), continues with the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ (Good Friday), and reaches its climax at the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday).

On *Holy Thursday*, we <u>receive the gift</u> of the Holy Eucharist: the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of

Jesus. We <u>enter into the deep meaning</u> of the Holy Priesthood. We <u>pour ourselves out</u> like the water in the basin used to wash feet, representing the service and charity of Christ. We <u>are asked with the disciples to hear, proclaim, and watch</u> with the Lord. We <u>are invited to enter with Him into his anguish</u> by imitating His Holy surrender in the Garden of Gethsemane.

On *Good Friday* we stand at the Altar of the Cross where heaven is rejoined to earth and earth to heaven. We enter into the moment that forever changed all human history, the great self-gift of the Son of God. Each of us is invited to venerate the cross individually, on which is hung our salvation.

On *Holy Saturday*, we remain in prayer and fasting at the tomb of the Lord; those to be baptized celebrate the final rites of preparation during the day. During the solemn Vigil, we look forward to the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection and we witness His Glory and the beginning of the New Creation.

**Paschal Fast:** The Paschal Fast should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and continue on Holy Saturday. In this way the people of God will receive the joys of the Lord's resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts. Good Friday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat.

#### Easter and Passover -

We, Christians, celebrate the central mystery of our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our Jewish neighbours celebrate the Feast of Passover: God's liberation and protection of the Jewish People in the Exodus from Egypt. The links between the two Feasts are profound. Easter, the Christian Feast of liberation, grew out of the Jewish Feast of the Passover. Christ, out of infinite love, freely underwent suffering and death because of the sins of all people, so that all might attain salvation. It is the duty of the Church in its preaching to proclaim the cross of Christ as the sign of God's universal love and the source of all grace. (Vatican Council II, Declaration on the Relations of the Church to non-Christian religions)

#### **Triduum**

From Latin: tri (three) Duum (days)

**Pronunciation:** tri-doo-oom

Also known as: Paschal Triduum, Holy Triduum,

Sacred Triduum, Easter Triduum.

Common Misspelling: Tridium, tridum, triddum,

tritium
