John 13.31-35 - Love as I Have Loved You

What is "new" (v.34) in Jesus' commandment? Loving God and neighbour was a central teaching from the time of Moses. We need to look at Jesus' whole life to find a pattern and shape of what love looks like.

Love involves:

- caring for people, especially the outcasts of society, the poor, and the sick;

- serving the needs of others, humbly and unselfishly;
- forgiving others everything, even one's enemies;
- including everyone as our neighbour, as a child of God; and

- Being willing to sacrifice everything for God' kingdom.
