TEACHING THE FAITH

CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Christian Initiation is a journey for those who decide to become intentional disciples, followers of Jesus and members of the Catholic Church.

A) BAPTISMAL PREPARATION



Are you interested in helping our pastor prepare young families for the baptism of their babies and teaching them about the sacrament of Baptism? Members of this team become familiar with the families by observing at one meeting with the parents, getting to know their needs and helping them find good candidates for godparents. A second meeting is scheduled with the parents and godparents and, if needed, they go to the church to familiarize everyone with the Rite of Baptism and the responses used during the ceremony.

B) SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

First Communion and Reconciliation – Catholic School - To prepare children in grade 2, and their parents, for these sacraments, you must become familiar with the program of Religious Education taught in the schools so that, as a volunteer, you may successfully continue with liturgical formation for these sacraments.

First Communion and Reconciliation – Public School – Children in public schools use the manual, "We Share in the Eucharist", to prepare for these sacraments. They join with students from Catholic school for liturgical formation.

<u>Confirmation</u> – Grades7 and 8 students prepare for this sacrament using the manual, "Confirmed in the Spirit". If you would like to be a catechist for these young people or organize their retreat or community service, now is your opportunity.

C) <u>CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)</u>

The whole Christian community initiates.

- 1) <u>Catechists</u>: This is a special ministry for those who give instruction in faith, who help educate and who prepare the candidate for the Rite of Acceptance, the Rite of Election and then the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.
- 2) **Sponsors**: As representatives of the community, they accompany the candidate and give him or her support through the period of pre-catechumenate and catechumenate until the Rite of Election when the candidate will choose godparents.

D) CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR CHILDREN

When children are in grade 3 or older, they are prepared for Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist following the same process as for adults but with instruction adapted for their age. We need catechists and sponsors who will prepare for their ministry through diocesan workshops and through continuing education with experienced facilitators.

These volunteers must follow the same formation program as those extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist who distribute Communion during Mass. Because of ministering to individuals in their homes, they must also undergo police screening. They must also understand the rules in retirement homes, nursing homes and care centres.

THE ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER FRATERNITY, SECULAR FRANCISCAN ORDER

The St. Joseph the Worker Fraternity belongs to an official Order of the Catholic Church, the Secular Franciscan Order. The Secular Franciscan Order (Ordo Franciscanus Saecularis) is a community of Catholic men and women in the world who seek to pattern their lives after Christ in the spirit of St. Francis of Assisi. Secular Franciscans are tertiaries, or members of the Third Order of St. Francis founded by St. Francis of Assisi 800 years ago. By profession, they promise to follow a Rule of Life approved and confirmed by Pope Paul VI in June of 1978.

To become a Secular Franciscan one must:

- profess the Catholic faith
- live in communion with the Church
- be of good moral standing
- have a discerned vocation to the Order

Membership in the order is attained through a time of initiation, a time of formation, and the Profession of the Rule. The process can take up to three years. Once a year, our fraternity holds a "Come and See" for those interested in finding out more about the possibility of becoming a Secular Franciscan.

An outward sign of a professed Secular Franciscan is the wearing of a Tau cross.



You will find Secular Franciscans involved in all aspects of parish life: extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, the Living Nativity, Healing Prayer Time, helping with children's summer Bible Camp. Also included is a focus on JPIC (Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation), Fair Trade, and the environment.

Specifically, the apostolate of our fraternity has chosen to support Dr. Andrew Simone in his effort to alleviate global starvation in Third World Countries. We organize the ongoing collection of staples for "Canadian Food for Children" and ensure the boxes of food given by our very generous parishioners are packed and shipped to the Mississauga Warehouse. We further assist Dr. Simone with a program called the "Bags of Love". Throughout the year our team collects hygiene items, school supplies, toys, and clothing to send to families in a country where there is great need.
