Jubilee of 2025 or Holy Year is

a special year of atonement and remission of sins, and debts. The practice has ancient roots in the Jewish tradition (Lev. 25). In the Old Testament a Jubilee was observed every 50 years as a time to restore a working

relationship with God and fellow man. The practice was adopted by the Catholic Church in 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII and in 1470 Pope Paul II declared a Jubilee take place every 25 years.

"All the faithful who are truly repentant and free from affection for sin, who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, during the Holy Year, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy communion, pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, will be able to obtain a plenary indulgence, which can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory in the following ways:

Making a pious pilgrimage to a cathedral, church or shrine selected by the local bishop. Performing corporal works of mercy like visiting prisoners; spending time with lonely elderly people; aiding the sick or disabled, helping those in need, performing acts of penance including abstaining at least one day a week from social media or television, fasting, donating to the poor, supporting religious or social works, volunteering, supporting migrants, the poor, young people in difficulty, and abandoned children."


