# The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

"I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the brad wich I shall

give for the life of the world is my flesh" (Jn 6:51). Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), we honours the Body of Christ, both in the Eucharistic and in the Church.

Corpus Christi reminds us to stand with Christ, walk toward Him, and kneel in His holy presence.

When we receive the Eucharist, we become one body in Christ. Standing together in Our Lord, we are united and as the Apostle Paule wrote, "Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all: Col 3:11).

As we walk toward Christ, we grow in union with Him. In this way, we each play our individual role as the whole of the world gathers-in under His fold.

As we kneel in adoration, we are choosing the freedom of Christ's call over the slavery of man's reign. In sacred silence, we come together and commune in the holy language of quitness. In these ways, "We", as a universal body, express our togetherness in Christ.

**World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests** – June 7 Catholics worldwide are urged to pray for Priests today on the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. The day was begun by Saint John Paul II in 2002 with the objective of having all Catholic faithful join in prayer for the sanctification of Priests. It coincides with the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.



**Are you saved?** Several times in Acts, the narrative speaks of being "saved," and Acts 4:12 reminds us that Jesus is the only Saviour of the world. Some Christians believe that "getting saved" is a one-time event, but the Scriptures clearly show salvation as a process that includes faith, repentance, baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and lifelong conversion. The Bible speaks of our salvation in three tenses. We have been saved from a life of slavery to sin (Romans 8.24), we are being saved as we daily clothe ourselves in Christ (1 Peter 3:21), and we will be saved forever if we persevere to the end (Matthew 10:22; Mark 13:13). This ongoing salvation is the result of our cooperation with the grace of God (see CCC 1996-2005).

**Parenting Tip of the Month** The data continues to grow on the dangers the internet can pose to children and on the benefit of time spent in play, both indoors and outdoors. For younger children this means play that uses their imaginations and does not include the internet. For older children, it may include such things as playing board games, doing puzzles and hiking.
