Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

U S H E R S – This is a reminder to those who ministry as ushers, that there are important meetings to discuss emergency fire procedures:

Those serving St. Joseph: Tue. June 18 at 7:45 p.m. Those serving St. Patrick: Wed. June 19 at 7 p.m. These meetings will take place in the Church you serve.

Diakonia – This Greek word, translated "service", marks the ministry of the seven men chose in Acts 6. Their task was to serve the people of God. In addition to caring for the poor, they would prove to be some of the most powerful teachers and evangelists written about in the Acts of the Apostles.

Living Tradition marks Acts 6 as the beginning of the order of deacons. St. Paul will later offer qualifications for this important office (1 Tim 3:8-11). At the Second Vatican Council, the permanent diaconate was re-established. There were three main reasons for this decision: (1) to enrich the Church with the functions of the diaconate, which otherwise could be exercised only with great difficulty in many regions; (2) to strengthen with the grace of diaconal ordination those who already exercised many of the functions of the diaconate; and (3) to provide sacred ministers to regions with a shortage of clergy. Today, deacons work in parishes, schools, hospitals, nursing homes, prisons, youth ministries, and wherever the Church may need them to serve. They deliver homilies, assist priests at Mass, conduct funeral services, baptize, and in some dioceses, officiate at marriage ceremonies. Most dioceses have formation programs for men discerning a call to the permanent diaconate. Extracted from Acts: The Spread of the Kingdom The Great Adventure

Listening Together: Meditations on Synodality


